UNIVERSITY REGISTRATION & COURSE SELECTION

Courses and Course Delivery:

1. PSYC 1013, PSYC 1023, ENGL 1213, ENGL 1413, RECR 1263, POLS 2783, BIOL 3013, GEOL 2753 and SOCI 1033 will be offered via Acadia University's distance education department.
2. A course facilitator (instructor) is assigned to each of these courses and each course is structured within our university course timetable.
3. Upon arrival in port all students, under the supervision of their instructor, will be taken to an internet research center where, minimally, 2 hours will be made available to download relevant information and to submit current assignments to the supervising professor at Acadia.

Registration at Acadia University & Course Selection Procedure:

1. Class Afloat students must apply, individually, via Acadia's "Online Admission Application" at: <https://central.acadiau.ca/apply/application?pageID=1163>
2. On that page, under "additional comments", **be sure to indicate that this is a Class Afloat Application.**
3. Supporting transcripts must be sent directly to Acadia University at: Acadia University, Room 126 University Hall, 15 University Avenue, PO Box 7, Wolfville, NS, B4P 2R6, Canada.

5. Please select courses for the semester or semesters for which you have enrolled, choosing a minimum of **TWO** courses and up to a maximum of **FOUR** courses per semester.
6. Class Afloat's university courses do not have high school prerequisites and, therefore, are available to all students. Note that students taking psychology must first complete PSYC 1013 prior to registering for PSYC 1023.
7. You may check only one selection in any row/group. Submit your selections to Class Afloat immediately after registering as an Acadia student.
8. In addition to courses selected, all students will be assigned and must attend Class Afloat non-credit courses in Cultural Discovery and Physical Education & Seamanship.
9. Upon receipt of your selections, Class Afloat will register you for the selected courses and arrange with Acadia to have your texts and course packs shipped directly to your home address.
